Extension of F-1 (I-20) Student Status

General Information and Eligibility

The program extension request form is to be used by an F-1 student who is unable to complete their course of study by the program end date on form I-20 (F-1 Student). To allow sufficient time for the extension procedure and SEVIS update, a student must submit their request to the PDSO/DSO at least 30 days before the expiration date of the I-20. A student who fails to request an extension prior to the program expiration date will be considered out of status and must apply to USCIS for reinstatement.

In order to be eligible for a program extension a student must:

1. Submit complete documentation to the PDSO/DSO for an extension at least 30 days before the program completion date listed on his/her current I-20.
2. Have continually maintained legal F-1 student status.
3. Seek an extension for a delay caused by a compelling academic or medical need for the extension, such as change of major or research topic, unexpected research problems, or documented illness.
4. If there is a change in funding source, provide financial documentation covering your educational and living expenses for the extension period.

Financial Documentation

If there is a change in your source of funding, you must provide proof that you will be able to continue to meet the expenses (living and education costs, including living expenses for dependent family members, if any) of studying at CST.

Please note: The extension procedure will extend your I-20 but not your visa stamp. If you have an expired visa stamp in your passport, you are permitted to remain in the US with a valid I-20. However, the next time you travel out of the US and need to reenter, you will still need to apply for a new visa stamp to return to the US.
