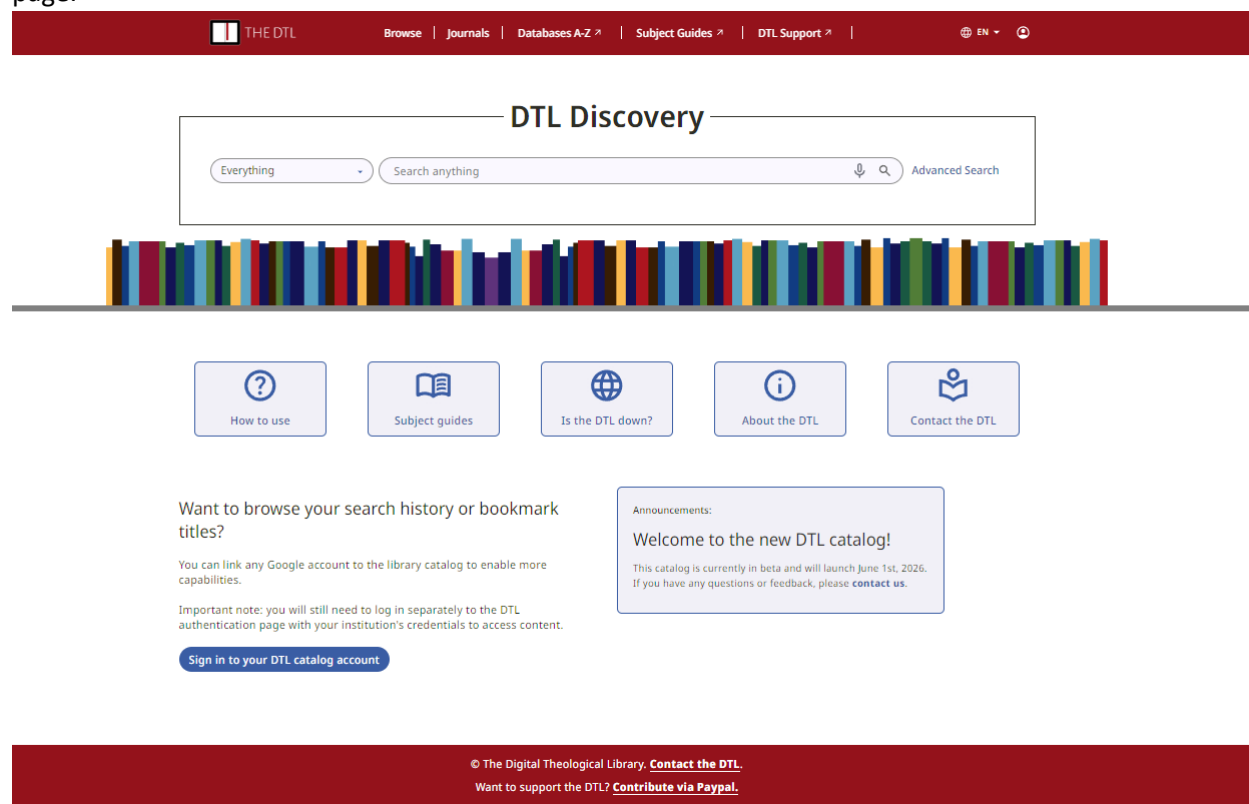
Because the DTL is fully online, you can access it from anywhere you have an internet connection.

Finding Materials

You do not need to log in to search the DTL. Simply type your search terms into the field on the front page.



You can also use the **Advanced Search** option by clicking the link to the right of the search field.

The **All Filters** icon, circled in green, will open the left sidebar with options for narrowing your search by date, material type, language, etc. Once you have found an item you're interested in, click either the title or the **Available Online** button, circled in yellow. Either of them will bring you to the item's record page.

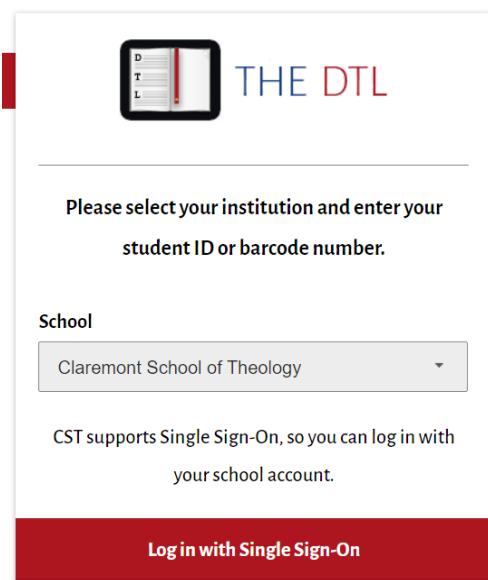

From here you can see a lot of information about the item. The image above does not include the entire page. In the record you will see more complete publication information, as well as related items and links to reviews, if the item is a book.

The **View Online** menu just below the first section will show at least one link to access the item, depending on how many databases give us access. If there are multiple links they will all lead to the same item, but the user experience might be different between different databases.

Once you click on one of those links you will be redirected to a login page. Begin typing “Claremont School of Theology” in the first field or select it from the drop-down list. After you select the school, you should see the **Log In with Single Sign-On** button.

Clicking that button will bring you to a Google page that will ask you to select the account to use for logging in. **Select your CST email address.** No other account will work. If you are not already logged into that account in your browser, you will need to provide your password. If you are not given the option to select an account and you receive an error indicating that you do not have access to the library, check your browser settings to see if your browser is already logged into a different account. You may need to log out or switch browser accounts.

Using Materials

From the login page, you will be taken to the database that houses the item. How you may interact with the item will depend upon the specific database, vendor, and publisher. You can usually download journal articles without restrictions, but restrictions will vary for ebooks. You can read most ebooks directly in your browser, and some databases will give you the option to download all or parts of the book, usually for a limited period of time, to read on your desktop in [Adobe Digital Editions](#). Some databases require you to make a free account within the database (separate from your DTL account) in order to download books. Make sure to look closely at the download requirements and options for each individual item.

Through its E-Reserves program the DTL also collects and scans physical books that cannot be obtained digitally. If a book you are trying to access is available through E-Reserves, you will be taken to an instruction page after you log in. You may need to contact your librarian (details below) in order to get access. E-Reserves materials cannot be downloaded.

Many books have limits on the number of users that can access them at one time. If you get an error message suggesting that there are too many users, check back later. Please be mindful of other users and make sure to close any books you are not currently using, especially if they are for course reading.
